### **Private Wilson Adison COSTELLO**

Wilson Adison COSTELLO, son of Simeon Wilson COSTELLO and Laurel Jean 'Jenny' FAUGHT, was born on 18 Mar 1922 in Westmeath Twp., Renfrew, Ontario, Canada. He was the 5<sup>th</sup> of 6 children: Albert, Donalda Taman, Wilson (infant), Laurel McCann, Wilson Adison and Charlotte. Wilson's father Simeon was born in Westmeath Twp., and his mother was born in Wilberforce Twp. After the children were born, the family moved to Carleton Place.<sup>1</sup>

According to his enlistment papers, Wilson attended school in Carleton Place including one year of high school. He then worked as a laborer at Carleton Place Dairy<sup>2</sup>.

Wilson enlisted on Sep 18, 1941 at Ottawa, just three months after his father was accidently killed. Wilson was described as 5' 10 ½" tall, weighing 137 pounds with medium complexion, hazel eyes & brown hair. He listed his next of kin and beneficiary as his mother Jean.<sup>2</sup>

Pte. Wilson Costello underwent training at Ottawa and Camp Borden with the Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps (RCAMC). He disembarked in the UK on Mar 29, 1942 and served there until June 1944. He was sent to France on D-Day, June 6, 1944 and served with the 23<sup>rd</sup> Field Ambulance (RCAMC).<sup>2,4</sup> On Jul 24, 1944, Pte. Wilson Adison Costello was killed in action against the enemy near Bourguebus, Departement du Calvados, Basse-Normandie, France, and buried close by. His remains were later moved to Beny-sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery, Reviers, Departement du Calvados, Basse-Normandie, France. 2,3,6,7 Six other casualties connected to Whitewater Region are buried in this cemetery. Lance Corporal Robert John Stevenson of Franklin, Manitoba died on Jun 6, 1944; Rifleman Gordon Howard Rollins of Beachburg died on Jun 11, 1944; Pte. Alfred Leonard Deighton of Pembroke died on Jun 26, 1944; Rifleman Mervyn Alexander Robinson of Beachburg died on Jul 5, 1944; Pte. Clifford Raymond Gibson of Ross Township died on Jul 8, 1944; and Gunner Ira Clifford Eady of Haley Station died on Jul 19, 1944.

In addition to the cemetery stone at Beny-sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery, Pte. Costello is also commemorated in Carleton Place with a street named in his honor.<sup>3</sup> His name is also engraved on the Carleton Place Cenotaph<sup>3,8</sup>, the Beachburg War Memorial<sup>10</sup> and the



killed in action in France, July 24, according to word just received by his mother. He went to France on D-Day and served with a field ambulance.

Enlisting in September, 1941, in Ottawa, with the Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps, he trained at Ottawa and Camp Borden proceeding overseas in March. 1942, and while crossing celebrated his 20th birthday.

Born in Pembroke, he le there when a small child wi his parents and came to Carleto Place, where he received his edu cation.

He accepted a position with the Carleton Place Dairy, and at the end of six months enlisted with the army.

Besides his mother he is survived by one brother, Albert Costello, and three sisters, Mrs. Clyde Taman, of Ottawa; Mrs. Cecil McCann and Miss Charlotte Costello, of Carleton Place.
