Flying Officer Royden Leslie COTNAM

Flying Officer Royden Leslie Cotman, son of George Charles Leslie Cotnam and Alice Esther Coburn, was born on 29 Aug 1920 in Pembroke Twp., Renfrew, Ontario, Canada. His parents were born in Pembroke Township and two of his grandparents were born in Westmeath Township. The family were part of the Greenwood community which sits at the junction of Westmeath and Pembroke Townships and close to Stafford Township. Royden's parents were farmers. He had one older sister, Eileen Sexsmith. Royden's second cousin Sgt. Pilot Harold Clinton Cotnam was killed in action in 1941 (before Royden enlisted).¹

Royden Leslie Cotnam enlisted on May 13, 1942 at Ottawa, Ontario at 21 years old. On his Attestation Papers, his Image 1: F/O Royden Leslie Cotnam² education was summarized as attending S.S.#3 Pembroke Twp from 1925-1932; Pembroke Collegiate Institute from 1932-1940 completing Jr. Matriculation (Grade 12) plus upper school

on April 8th.

Leslie Cotnam of Greenwood, who is reported missing and be-

that this pilot was one of three killed by faulty bomb fuses.⁵

English & composition. He spoke French & English. His occupation was warehouseman and salesman at National Grocers, Pembroke from 1940-enlistment. He had previously worked on father's farm. His religion was listed as United Church and his father Leslie Cotman was his next of kin. His sports interests included ruby, softball and swimming. He was described as 5' 9 1/2" tall, weighing 162 lbs. He had a fair complexion, blue eyes and fair hair. His previous experience included Lanark & Renfrew Scottish, Pembroke from July 1940-Feb 1942. He left to join the RCAF. He had previously made application in Ottawa on Feb 1942 but changed his preference to an observer or pilot. His references were Rev. Brown, Pembroke; R.H. Davison, manager National Grocers; Wallace Fraser, Mayor of Pembroke; R.B. Summerhays, Principal.³


F/O Royden Cotman served with the 417 Squadron, RCAF # J/26636. He was based at Toronto, Rockcliffe, Oshawa and Camp Bordon before being transferred to Halifax Jun 11, 1943 He was awarded his pilots flying badge on May 28, 1943.³

On April 8, 1945 after operations overseas, F/O Cotman's plane was reported missing. The 417 (City of Windsor) Squadron's Spitfire LF.IX MK951 left base at 17:55 to bomb a target near Lendinara and exploded in a bomb dive south-east of Lendinara, Italy. 4 It was another inexplicable casualty as no flak was encountered or seen by the other 2 aircrafts on the mission. The suspicion was

F/O Cotnam was 24 years old. He was buried in Padua War Cemetery, Padua, Provincia di Padova, Veneto, Italy. 2,3,7,8 There were 14 other Canadians buried in this cemetery including another member of 417 Squadron – Pilot Officer Reginald Wolfe McKinnon.⁹

The family were notified on Nov 21, 1945 that F/O Cotnam's status was changed from 'missing' to 'believed killed in action'.³

In addition to the cemetery stone at Padua War Cemetery, F.O. Royden Cotnam name is engraved on two cemetery stones in Wesley United Cemetery, Pembroke Ontario. His parent's gravestone contains his name; on one side of a 4-sided stone his name is also engraved and the name of Alexander McKenzie (1831-1891) is on another side. ¹⁰ I am not aware of the connection to Mr. McKenzie. His name is also commemorated on the Greenwood United Church WWII Honour Roll¹¹; Greenwood United Church Tablet dedicated to casualties of WWII soldiers, Greenwood United Church¹²; the Pembroke Collegiate Institute WWII Paque¹³; and The Pembroke War Memorial (Air Force Panel)¹⁴. His name is also recorded on a number of websites dedicated to Airmen. 15,16,17








Image 4: Greenwood UC WWII Honor Roll¹¹






Image 5: PCI WWII Honor Roll¹³
